A Study Tour was organized for F.Y& S.Y.B.Sc Students on 18<sup>th</sup> October 2023 by the Department of Zoology. Sahebraoji Buttepatil Mahavidyalaya, Rajgurunagar. A total 40students, 5 teacher staff participated in the field visit. As part of the syllabus of Savitribai Phule Pune University, the field visit was organized and through this ,the students were exposed to rich faunal diversity in dense Forest ,Lush hills, sparkling Waterfalls . The field visit programme was planned for one day under the leadership of HOD, Prof S.S. Naikare. Dr. S. M. Jagtap, Prof. M. P. Kolhe, Prof. Sainath Pacharane. The journey started from Sahebraoji Buttepatil Mahavidyalaya, Rajgurunagar. We go by Following Route:-

Rajgurunagar-----Wada-----Bhorgiri-----Bhimashankar

After around 2 hours we reach at the Bhorgiri and Journey Start by Feet for the Bhimashankar. There we visit the temple of Lord Shiva, which is one of the Jyotirlinga from 12 Jyotirlinga. After That we move toward the Bhimashankar Wildlife Sanctuary.

In the entire journey of sanctuary we observed various wild animals.

A detailed survey of the fauna was done. The sanctuary is very rich in faunal diversity. There we observed Giant Squirrel(*Ratufaindica*), Blue Mormon Butterfly, various insects like beetles, aphids, bugs, moths, butterflies and various Arthropods like crustacean, scorpion, spiders, millipedes, centipedes, Molluscs, Birds, Reptiles like Salamander and Mammals.

The field visit was very knowledgeable and gave great experience.
