1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Sahebraoji Buttepatil College is Co-educational institution was established by Khed Taluka Shikshan Prasarak Mandal in the year 2018 and located at Rajgurunagar. It was named after late Sahebraoji Buttepatil, the founder Chairman of KTSPM. He used to say that "I am as happy when I go to the college as when I go to the temple". The college is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune and recognized by Government of Maharashtra. It offers Five undergraduate (BA, BCOM, BSc, BBA, BSc- IT) courses and Two Postgraduate (MCOM and MSc- Microbiology). During the establishment of the college the strength of the students was 150 in 2018 and now it reached to 1000 till 2023. Arts faculty includes special subjects like History, Political Science and Economics. Microbiology and Chemistry in Science and Banking and Finance, Cost and Works Accounting and Marketing Management in Commerce.

To ensure employment and entrepreneurship development through education the college provides career-oriented skills and courses in the college. Short-term courses like Computerized Accounting, Production of Biofertilizer, Book Creation Skills, Printed Research Skills and Democratic Elections and Political Process have also been initiated. To provide computer training for commerce stream, a separate computer lab is formed and inaugurated by Hon. Chairman of KTSPM Adv.Devendraji Buttepatil Saheb. An updated laboratory is set for respective subjects like Microbiology and Chemistry. The Examination department provides proper advice and guidance to the students for university and college level examinations.

Various committees formed by the college administration look after the development of each individual who enters the premises. The college has come up with an Annual Magazine of its own which informs parents and student about recent development, activities, and initiatives taken by college for future upgradations. With expertise and experienced faculty members, the objectives of the college are being achieved. The tradition of sharing and exploring knowledge and expanding the horizons is going eternally. The academic result of the college is also excellent which motivates the students to take admission in the college. For comprehensive development of the students, competitive Exam Centre, Cultural activities, Sport Activity, Earn and Learn Scheme and Students Welfare Scheme, NSS have been run successfully.

Curricular Aspects

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The college follows the curriculum and Choice Based Credit System pattern as prescribed by Savitribai Phule Pune University. The college offers undergraduate programs in B.A, B.COM, B.SC, BBA in under graduate program and M.COM, M.SC in post-graduation program. The courses are run through multidisciplinary approach.

The college given proper guidance to the students regarding admission through admission committee. College prepare academic calendar at the beginning of the academic year. College collected teaching plan, syllabus completion report, annual report, student attendance sheet, Internal evaluation record of all faculty.

Examination, syllabus and evaluation done by university norms. Student well prepare their projects, internship, field visit report and other extra curriculum activity. The college has offer value added course for student's progression and support. Staff meeting is held periodically throughout the academic year.

The college offered Choice Based Credit System, Elective course and certificate courses related to academic flexibility for growing gender and ethics. Gender related course are an integral component of various courses e.g. Marathi, Economics, Sociology, Political Science, English. Environment studies is a major subject and its compulsory for second year class for all branches. The college accepted professional ethics, gender equality, human value, conservation of environment through various subjects in the curriculum. College has taken feedback form from various authorities and prepare feedback report every year from the establishment which keeps us motivated for next years. Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The Internal Assessment Committee ensures everyone is informed about the evaluation process, any changes, and continuous assessment updates. The Principal also explains the internal assessment system, including the pattern of questions, assignments, and oral and written exams.

This institute is affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU). The syllabus and outcomes for each course are designed by the Board of Studies (BOS) and are available on the university and college websites.

Each course has specific outcomes and evaluation criteria. These outcomes are linked to program outcomes, which measure how well the program goals are achieved. Student performance during exams help to determine the achievement levels of these outcomes. The mapping of course outcomes (COs), program outcomes (POs), and program-specific outcomes (PSOs) is done by the IQAC Coordinator with input from other faculty members.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The college has Academic Research Committee which guides the faculty members for initiating research activities. ARC conduct Avishkar Competition for student and promotes students to participate in Avishkar Research Convention organized by college as per guideline of SPPU, Pune and also participate in science exhibitions organized by colleges. Three faculty members have completed their Ph.D. and Five faculty members have published 06 research papers in National journals and International journals and presented in workshops. The faculty members have published 17 books.

Field work, assignments, project reports, dissertations, educational tours and visits being the part of curriculum at UG and PG level, students are motivated by their concerned academic supervisors to conduct local issue-based research-oriented works. The College collaborate for internship, field trip, On-job training, research etc during the last five years.

Further, the College is committed to develop not only good human resources but also sensible citizens. The College has a dedicated National Service Scheme (NSS) which takes care of various activities in campus as well as in its neighbourhood community. The College also has Women Study Cell which organizes several events for women empowerment. The NSS undertake various activities like tree plantations, cleaning drives, awareness programs on social issues (like dowry, gender equality, girl education, nutrition) etc. in campus and nearby villages.

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Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Our college regularly updates its infrastructure, including classrooms, offices, labs, library, playgrounds, and more, using funds from the management. Our college library, established in 2018, is pivotal in providing timely and relevant information. Students have access to books for both reading and borrowing. The library has Books, periodicals, journal, Newspapers which enable the students to acquire information, knowledge, and skills required for their study programmes They can also borrow magazines for reading in the hall as reference materials. Our computer lab serves our community by providing essential computer services. Access typically requires valid login credentials to track user activities. We prioritize safety with round-the-clock security provided by guards and surveillance cameras. Each year, the college prepares budget estimates to meet departmental, library, and administrative needs. Equipment maintenance and overall campus up keep, are managed through outsourcing agencies to ensure effective maintenance.

- The results are checked and analyzed.
